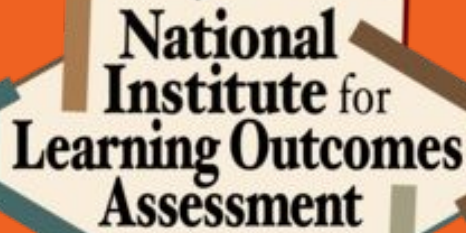

So, what's a charrette?

char·rette

/SHə'ret/ 

noun NORTH AMERICAN

a meeting in which all stakeholders in a project attempt to resolve conflicts and map solutions.

Intents of an assignment design charrette:

- Faculty can receive diverse & valuable feedback on assignments
- Align assignments with curriculum
- Improve student performance / outcomes (student success)
- Transparency in assignment design / inclusive for all learners

Face to face charrettes:

- 2-4 hour time commitment (even for Zoom or Google Meet)
- Usually during business hours (...excludes some faculty)

So, what's VoiceThread?



VOICETHREAD

Tool for authentic communication:

- Asynchronous discussion
 - Video, voice, and text commenting
- Can upload images, videos, documents, slides, embed media, etc.

BASICS

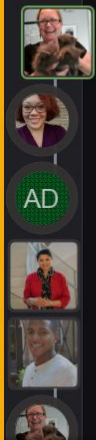
You can upload slides or images to VoiceThread, or just record yourself talking. VT is basically an online video discussion board.

COMMENTING

You can either create a new VT or reply to someone else's. When leaving a comment, you can choose text, voice, or webcam. Use the webcam, it personalizes the discussion.

NAVIGATING

You can upload a series of different slides or background images in VT. You can upload videos, embed YouTube videos, use images, draw on slides, or include links to external sites.



Why a VoiceThread Charrette?



1. **Asynchronous** faculty development pilot
2. Creating **community** for adjuncts and interdisciplinary teaching faculty in online spaces
3. **Innovation**
 - a. **Access** to assignment design for online, adjunct, overcommitted or remote faculty
 - b. **Piloting** VoiceThread as a tool for fac-dev
 - i. **Introduce** faculty to VT (and one another)

Faculty: Reflective Statement

- ◎ Purpose of the assignment
 - Intended outcomes
- ◎ Context for assignment
 - Course, curriculum, students
- ◎ Previous experience with this assignment
 - What worked, what didn't
- ◎ Questions you have about the assignment
 - What feedback are you seeking?
 - Why this assignment, why now?

Facilitation



- © Due dates & deadlines
- © Discussion norms / guidelines (ie. golden rule, safe space)
- © Doing all the prep work (helping faculty with VT)

Feedback from pilot

Comments:

- ◎ Adjunct faculty felt included 😊
- ◎ Wanted shorter deadlines (<2 wks)
- ◎ Ask a specific question / address a specific issue with the assignment

Suggestions:

- ◎ 3-5m comment time limit
- ◎ More icebreakers, more creation of community
- ◎ Feedback form to organize feedback (Google Form, not just verbal)
